Been awhile since last newsletter as BMC has been working hard to organize a 2023 season. We are please to announce that we will be returning to the Sartin Arena in Sunnyside for April & May shows. Both venue & cattle have been secured and judges hired. We are, however, facing increasing costs with everything. In an effort to continue to produce good shows with fresh cattle in all classes, we had to take a critical look at our entry fee schedule. Fees have not changed for several years but the time has come to make some hard choices. We find it necessary to increase the the entry fees in most classes:

Open - \$155 Includes jackpot
Non-Jackpot Classes - \$130
Youth - \$90
Ranch Horse - \$85
Boxing - \$85
Futurity Works - \$90

Miscellaneous Fees (Sartin Arena only):

String Cow - \$15
Practice Pen - \$25
Stalls - \$25

New this year; before you leave you are required to leave a clean stall and there will be no exceptions. If your stall is found to be not cleaned prior to your departure from the show grounds, an additional fee will be assessed and could jeopardize your ability to rent a stall in the future.

As most of you know, there is construction underway in the arena area of the Monson Feedlot. We are watching the progress and hope to be our new arena by the June show.
